- Two members of the Service Delivery Team to deliver and collect the items
- To provide delegated authority to Mayor's Secretary/Receptionist to work within budget to have the Mayor and Deputy Mayor's chain cleaned and polished in the 2025/26 financial year, prior to the Mayor elect taking office.

## **Report Summary**

Saltash has a rich history of civic regalia with the current maces having been presented to the town in 1699. The maces are used at Civic events and are carried by the Town Sergeant and Mace Bearer.

In addition, the regalia includes two oar maces dating back to 1760, a small silver oar approximately and a pepper pot all of which are used during Mayor Making. It is widely believed that the small silver oar could be the only one of its kind and was used by the Collector of Port Dues as proof of his authority.

The town's Civic regalia is of historical importance and needs to be maintained in order to preserve it.

The silver regalia has not been cleaned professionally in many years and is tarnished in places. It's recommended that it is sympathetically cleaned and polished professionally.

This includes to sympathetically clean and polish

- 2 x large maces
- 2 x small silver oars
- 1 x mini oar
- 1 x pepper pot

The business is located in Plymouth with convenient access for Service Delivery to deliver and collect the items in the electric van. The business has confirmed their insurance will cover all the items whilst on their premises and the Town Council's insurance will cover the delivery and collection when undertaken by Town Council staff.

The Mayor's Chain and Deputy Mayor's Chain require cleaning and some minimal repair work to the enameling. The best time to undertake this would be in April/May when the Mayor elect has been chosen and there is an opportunity to get them done before Mayor Making takes place. Unfortunately, Company A have been unable to quote for the cleaning and repair of the chains in time for this evening's meeting.

Civic Events will be considered prior to the cleaning taking place.

#### **How Does This Meet the Business Plan?**

The maintenance of the Civic Regalia supports the strategic priority for Boosting Jobs and Economic Prosperity by promoting Saltash as a vibrant and welcoming visitor destination; encouraging people to visit the town during events to see the Civic Regalia on parade. In addition, it supports the strategic priority for Recreation and Leisure by providing and supporting cultural activities in the town; Saltash has a long tradition of Civic parades where the Regalia is used and residents and visitors enjoy seeing this.

Research on suitable companies to undertake the cleaning and polish has been undertaken. There are very few companies suitable to undertake the cleaning due to insurance and storage. Other Town Councils were approached for recommendations on businesses used. Based on one such recommendation another company was asked to quote; however, they charge £150 to quote which is not normal practice for the Town Council when obtaining quotes. In addition, their insurance would not cover all items to be stored on their premises resulting in multiple trips to Bodmin by the

Service Delivery Team to drop off and collect the items. It was decided that this

would not be the best use of staff time.
