



## DRAFT Safer Saltash Delivery Plan 2026-27 v0.1

The aim of Safer Saltash is to **improve community safety and reduce crime and antisocial behaviour** by targeting resources to the people and places that need it most within the geographical area, and working with **communities, partners and the business and voluntary sectors** to develop **sustainable solutions**.

Safer Saltash will facilitate and support a multi-agency approach to community safety issues to improve public reassurance, reduce the risk of harm to the community and protect vulnerable groups. Communities will be actively involved in the work of the partnership which will encourage social inclusion and community resourcefulness through being part of the problem-solving process. Achieving safer communities depends upon everyone working together to find local solutions to local problems.

Based on the evidence presented in the Saltash Town Profile and feedback from the Residents Survey, the following have been identified as community safety priorities for the town:

<b>Reduce the harms of drugs and alcohol</b>
<b>Domestic abuse and violence against women and girls are not tolerated, and people can live free of fear</b>
<b>Prevent and reduce antisocial behaviour, focusing on the people and places that need the most help</b>
<b>Youth engagement</b>
<b>Crime prevention and improved feelings of safety</b>
<b>Community engagement and building community resilience</b>

These priorities will be addressed through this delivery plan. Progress will be measured through achievement of quarterly and annual milestones over the lifetime of the plan and key deliverables/outcomes will be reported to the Safer Cornwall Partnership.
